Existing Ordinance adopted in 2005

Currently there are three residential parking areas in the city:

14 spaces on the west side of Avenida Menendez between Bridge Street and St. Francis Street

12 spaces on the north side of Saragossa Street between Cordova Street and Sevilla Street

19 spaces on the north side of Saragossa Street between Riberia Street and Ponce de Leon Blvd (US-1)

Intent is to repeal and replace ordinance, new ordinance draws from

- Arlington, VA
- Town of West Palm, FL
- San Francisco, CA



RPPP: *Eligibility and criteria for establishing controlled parking residential areas*

To be considered, a residential block must have parking overspill from out of area vehicles on an ongoing basis at least four days per week and nine months per year.

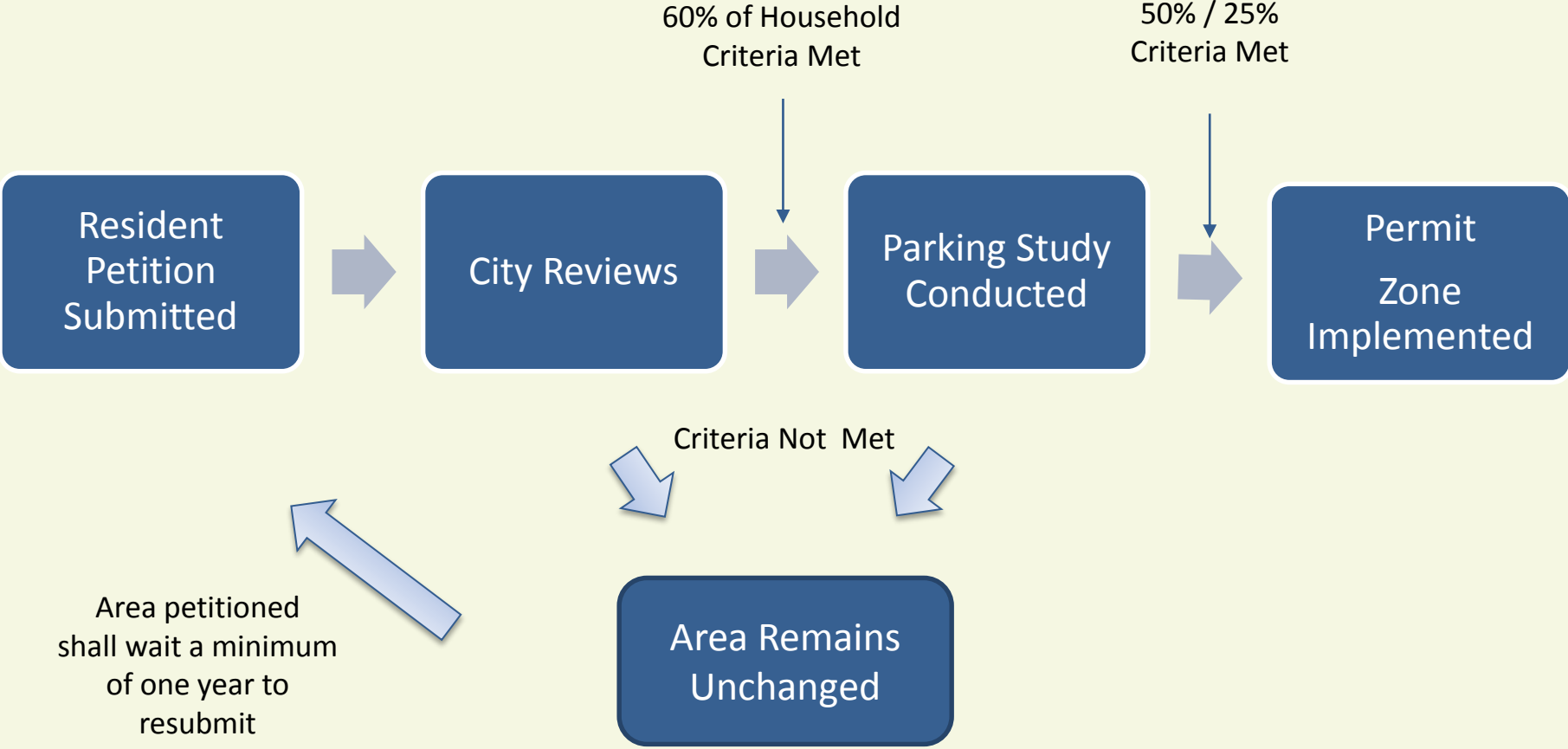
All of the following criteria must be met:

1. Petition with at least 60% of households on each block
2. 50% of on-street parking is utilized
3. 25% or more of those vehicles are not registered in the name of a person residing in the area

This is known as the 60/50/25 rule.



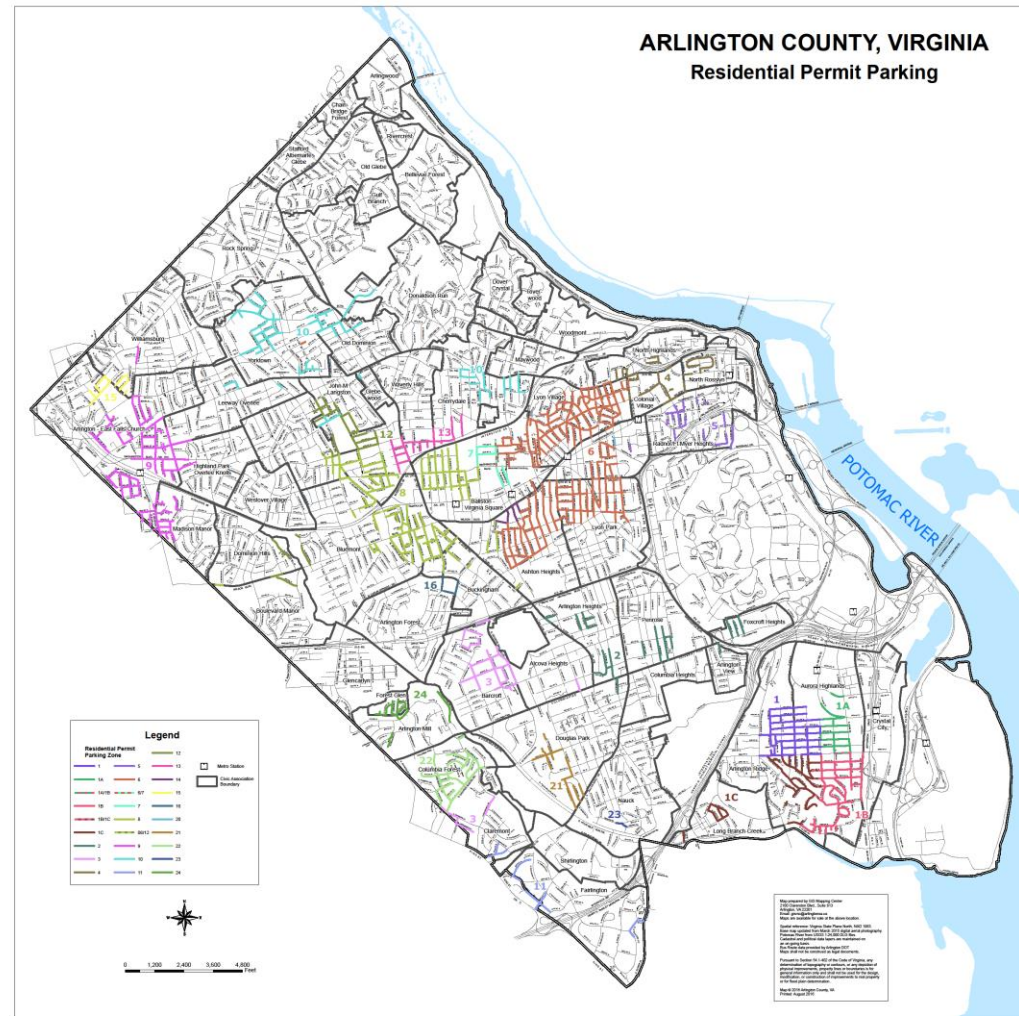
RPPP: Procedure Flow Chart

RPPP: *Additional Information*

- Number of Permits & Passes for a Household
 - 2 Resident Permits
 - 2 Guest/Service Passes
- Temporary Group Permits
 - Issued per event and only up to 50% of parking capacity
- Removal of a Zone
 - Requires petition signed by 60% of households
- Annual Permit Renewal
- Fee Schedule
 - Remains the same
